(Insurance Commissioner Candidate Version)

I pledge, if elected, to oppose all measures and efforts which would facilitate implementation of the health care overhaul law enacted in March 2010.\*

I shall initiate any necessary and appropriate action to block its implementation and shall oppose measures accepting federal funds that could lock our state into putting provisions of the law in place.

I shall oppose measures and efforts that would facilitate implementation of the law or any of its component parts, including those that would impose mandates, restrict patient and doctor choice and control over medical decisions, violate individual freedom and privacy, reduce competition, create any state or state-controlled bureaucracies or increase fees or taxes to comply with the law.
